She loved to sew! Aunt Hildy and Grandmama would sew and sew (a lot of it was for me!). She made me dolls when I was little :) and after I got grown, she made me hand made Santas at Christmas. She started my love for Christmas Village houses - even got me my first church, because, she said, you build your village around the church. She fussed at me when I was young (I needed it) and she gave me advice when I got grown. She always ended any conversation with "I love you and if you need me, call me" and I knew she meant it. She always tried to make me see the good in things and people and situations. And, I always felt better after I talked with her. I haven't spoken with her much over the last year on the phone, because she couldn't understand me and I couldn't hear her, but I did get to visit with her sporadically for an hour here and there. Aunt Hildy, who will tell me they love me, talk to me about Daddy, Grandmama and Granddaddy? Who is going to tell me it's going to be ok and that "it will all work out"? I went to another funeral not to long ago, and my friend was telling me they felt like an orphan. I thought, how can you feel that way? You have a spouse, children, grandchildren, cousins, etc. well, I understand now... I guess I thought you would be here forever. You were so strong and put up such a good fight. I just didn't want to see that you were losing your fight. I'm rambling I know... I'm sorry... I love you Aunt Hildy. I will miss you for the rest of my life. We've had this conversation before, but, don't worry about the cemetery. I promised Grandmama I would take care of everybody. I love you. Goodbye Aunt Hildy. Y'all please keep the family, Buddy (Earl Foreman) and Gail (Aunt Hildy's children) and their children and grand children in your prayers. It is so hard to lose your parents.
