Alfred Lee Stockton was born in Jefferson County, Alabama on February 19, 1950, to the late Hubert Andrew Stockton and Era Amick Stockton. Alfred, as he is known only in Alabama, graduated from Hueytown High School in 1968. He was a member of the Hueytown Church of God until he started pastoring in 1976. He married his high school sweetheart and the love of his life on May 29, 1973. He served his country overseas in the Army during the Vietnam War. Lilly Gay and Al moved to Abilene, Kansas where they lived for 3 months until moving back to Alabama. Al accepted the call to preach in 1976 and they began their ministry pastoring. Together, Al and Gay, pastored six churches, but their ministry reached even further than the four walls of a worship service. Al was a spiritual father and mentor to so countless others. Al served the Mississippi Church of God on the State Council, Evangelism Board and the Youth Board. He loved the church, and he loved the people. His life was loving the Lord, loving His wife, loving his kids and loving their families. If Al wasn't preaching, teaching, or spending time with his family then he would love to be fishing. Through rain or shine he would fish until the sun went down; the weather didn't matter in his eyes. Now if you went fishing with him you were expected to be quiet and to take care of yourself because when he went fishing... he wanted to fish. He even cast one time and caught Lilly Gay.

Al was actively pastoring the West Point Church of God when he passed from this world into the Presence of His Savior. Al Stockton touched many lives

with his kindness, bright smile, and his corny jokes. His legacy will continue to do the same for years to come.
