Mr. Henry Kirvin Stringer, 97, passed away on May 24, 2015, at Vicker's Personal Care Home in Starkville. Mr. Stringer was born February 19, 1918, in Delhi, Oklahoma, the son of the late Herbert L. and Mary Mitchell Stringer. He was a Minister of the Gospel, having Pastored Baptist churches in Louisiana, South Dakota, Mississippi, and Colorado. In addition to Pastoring churches, he worked as a Consultant for A.B. Culbertson in Fort Worth, Texas, a firm specializing in church planning and construction. He enjoyed building houses and more especially, building churches. He was a member of First Baptist Church in Starkville. He was an avid fisherman, who loved not only to fish, but to cook fish and share with his family and friends. He was a United States Army/Air Force Veteran of World War II.
