



Mr. Kamil S. Kassees

July 14, 1928 - December 9, 2018

Mr. Kamil S. Kassees, 90, passed away on December 9, 2018, at his residence in Richmond, KY. Mr. Kamil was born in Jerusalem in Palestine on July 14, 1928, the son of the late Dr. Saadallah and Asma MuSallem Kassees. He first worked as an electronic aircraft engineer for Lockheed-Martin in Marietta, GA. He then went to work for E. Systems in Dallas, TX, before moving to West Point. He was also an United States Army Veteran. He was a member of the Episcopal Church of the Incarnation in West Point. He married Frances Speed Kassees on April 28, 1961, and she passed away January 7, 2007. In addition to his parents and wife, Mr. Kamil was predeceased by his brother: John Kassees; Two Sisters: Doris Salman and Wedad Akel and his brother-in-law: Louie Mugannam.
