Walter Lee Nichols, 95, passed away, on Thursday, December 19, 2013 at North MS Medical Center, in West Point. Walter Lee Nichols was born February 11, 1918 in McCondy, Mississippi to the late Nannie Lee Westbrooks Nichols and Shelba Topp Nichols. He worked as a Communicable Disease Investigator for the for Mississippi State Board of Health 40 years and was a member of First United Methodist Church. He was member of West Point Masonic Lodge #40 F & AM, the West Point York Rite Bodies and a member of the Hamasa Shrine Temple of Meridian. He had served on the West Point Housing Authority Board of Commissioners for 23 years. He was a Veteran of the U. S. Army having served during WWII.
