Mr. Richard Wayne "Dick" Braman, 89, passed away on August 19, 2019 at North Mississippi Medical Center in West Point. Mr. Dick was born on April 19, 1930, in Loyal Oak, Ohio, the son of the late Weir and Vera Mildred Shook Braman. Mr. Dick was a Veteran of the United States Navy, where he was a Pilot. 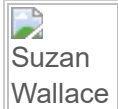

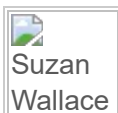
