



Mr. Robert Allen Snow Jr.

November 25, 1925 - March 26, 2017

Mr. Robert Allen Snow, Jr., 91, passed away on March 26, 2017, at his daughter's home near West Point. Mr. Robert was born on November 25, 1925, in Philadelphia, the son of the late Robert Allen and Sarah Anne Eva Moody Snow, Sr. Mr. Robert was a longstanding member of Stallo Methodist Church in Stallo. Mr. Robert was the CEO of Waverley Mansion located near West Point. Mr. Robert was a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity at The University of Alabama. Mr. Robert was a Receptient of the National Historic Landmark and National Register of Historic Places. Mr. Robert won numerous local and national Restoration Awards. Recently the Mississippi Senate passed a resolution honoring the legacy of the Robert and Madonna Snow Family as Pioneers in Historic Preservation in Mississippi. Mr. Robert married Madonna Guthrie Snow on December 18, 1950, in Tucker and she preceded him in death on December 20, 1991. In addition to his parents and wife, he was predeceased by a grandson, Robert Wayne Decker, Jr. and a brother, Kenneth Snow.

Funeral services will be Wednesday, March 29, 2017 at 1:00 P.M. at his beloved Waverley Mansion with Reverend Anne Harris officiating. Graveside Services will follow at 4:00 P.M. from the Holy Rosary Catholic Church Cemetery in Tucker. Calvert Funeral Home of West Point is in charge of arrangements.
